THE DECISION OF JUDGE IS FINAL!!!!!

Handling of Rabbit: The exhibitor should be judged on how they pick-up, carry, and turnover their rabbit. The exhibitor may also be asked to place and remove their rabbit from a carrier.

Posing Rabbit On Table: The exhibitor should be judged on how well they are able to pose their rabbit. The rabbit should be appropriately posed for its breed standard. The exhibitor should be able to keep the animal posed while on the table.

Examination of Rabbit: The exhibitor is expected to be able to examine his/her rabbit for disqualifications, faults, and breed characteristics. The exhibitor is expected to be able to demonstrate this to the judge. The exhibitor should be able to accomplish this in a smooth systematic and confident manner.

Exhibitor Knowledge: The exhibitor may be quizzed on their general rabbit knowledge and/or knowledge of the breed that they are showing. The number and type of questions that the judge asks will depend on the age division and time available.

Appearance and Attitude Of Exhibitor: The exhibitor should appear neat and clean. It is recommended that the exhibitor wear a long sleeved shirt or show coat (No preference given). The exhibitor should pay attention to the judge, be courteous, and exhibit good behavior.

Condition of Rabbit: The rabbit should be healthy and properly prepared for the show.

The judge shall tally their own scorecards. The exhibitor with the highest points will be the winner, the exhibitor with the second highest point total will be second, etc. The judge will place 1st thru 5th place. Ties will be determined by the judge. The judge does not need to reveal their scorecard, but is encouraged to inform exhibitors of areas they need to work on for next year's project.
